

**June McKoy, MD, MPH, JD, MBA**  
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Dr. June M. McKoy is an Associate Professor of Medicine and Preventive Medicine at Northwestern University Feinberg School of Medicine, an academic geriatrician on the staff of Northwestern Memorial Hospital, a licensed Illinois Attorney, and a NIH-funded clinical cancer/health services researcher whose focus is on utilizing and interweaving research into daily practice in order to ensure better health for aging individuals. As Director of Geriatric Oncology at the Robert H. Lurie Comprehensive Cancer Center of Northwestern University, she co-founded the Senior Oncology Outcomes Advocacy and Research (SOAR) program that translates research on cancer health measures into advocacy based interventions to improve health-related quality of life and survivorship for older individuals. Dr. McKoy is a strong proponent of holistic healthy aging, believing that to age well one must balance mind, body, and spirit. She has been featured in multiple print and electronic media, including (but not limited to) the New York Times, the Chicago Tribune, Talking Points Memo, The Guardian, Public Television, and NBC news. She is the Program Director for the Geriatric Medicine Fellowship Program at Northwestern University, an NIH Study Section Reviewer and co-chair, a 2015 Impact Center Women's Leadership Fellow, a member of the NCCN Senior Adult Panel, an appointed member of the NCI's National Council of Research Advocates and most importantly, a member of the Cancer and Aging Research Group (CARG) based at *City of Hope* and led by Dr. Arti Hurria.
