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
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

Training

- Including geriatric competences in fellowship curricula
- Training community healthcare workers
- Create centers of excellence in geriatric oncology

Clinical Care

- Disseminating validated tools in various languages
- Promoting team-building

Research

- International collaborative projects
- Fostering funding for global cancer and aging

We all work in resource-limited settings

Training

- Online training courses in collaboration with SIOG, ASCO, etc.
- Global fellowships with a “train the trainer” model to establish centers of excellence

Clinical Care

- Global online tumor boards and sessions.
- Dissemination of tools in various languages, app development.

Research
